





NOTICE TO PATRONS.

CONDITIONS OF RACING.

All races to be run under the Rules of Racing made under the Constitution and rules of the West Australian Trotting Association Incorporated.

REFUSAL OF NOMINATION.

The Committee may, in its absolute discretion, at any time after receipt of a nomination, cancel the same without giving any reason therefor.

RE-HANDICAPPING OF HORSES.

If, after the handicaps are declared for a race, a horse wins or is placed in another race, the handicap of that horse may be re-adjusted by the Handicapper.

STARTING.

When once a horse has weighed out and is on the track, it shall be considered to be under the Starter's orders.

PROTESTS.

A driver of a competing horse may protest against the winner or any placed horse on the ground of interference, crossing, jostling, or any improper act or conduct of the driver of such horse. The protest must be made to a Steward or Clerk of the Scales BEFORE THE DRIVER LEAVES THE SCALES after weighing in.

BOOKMAKERS.

The public is notified that Bookmakers fielding in the Enclosure are required to lay odds to \$5 up to 10 to 1, and \$3 over 10 to 1; and in the Leger to \$3 up to 10 to 1, and to \$1 over 10 to 1.





INTERESTING FACTS ABOUT THE ELECTRIC LIGHTING SYSTEM INSTALLED AT GLOUCESTER PARK.

There has been over 750 miles of electric wire used.

The largest lighting system in the world.

Association employs over a million and a half candle-power.

The current consumed would light 14,000 homes.

- The whole of the controlling electric switches were made in Australia.
- To give the artificial daylight effect on the Track means the diffusion of three-quarters of a million candle-power.
- The lamp reflectors giving the diffusion were the result of years of study, and were specially designed and patented for The West Australian Trotting Association Incorporated for the benefit of the West Australian public, and the world generally.
- The steel poles supporting the lighting of the track are made of weldless high tensile steel tubing, of British manufacture, heavily galvanised, and have a tensile strength of 40 tons per square inch.
- The steel poles are supporting a strain equal to 15 tons in mid-air suspension.
- There are 1,000 underground electrical wires leaving the Judge's Box, controlling over 800 lamps in the Result and Scratching Boards.
- The whole of the above work was carried out by the Association's Electricians, Messrs. C. A. Brear and H. Doonan, of Perth.


- Of £375; second horse to receive £75; third horse £25, and horse recording fastest time, whether placed or not, £75 out of the stake. For horses handicapped 2.11 or better.
- The Championship will be conducted on the Points System. Points will be gwarded as follows : First horse, 3 points: second horse, 2 points; and third horse, 1 point. Horses recording fastest time in all Championship events will be awarded 3 points; second fastest time, 2 points; and third fastest time, 1 point. Points will be allotted in the Grand Final, the same as in guglifying divisions.
- The horses gaining the greatest aggregate of points will be eligible to start in the Grand Final. The Final will be for nine, but the Grand Council shall have the power to extend the number of starters. The total of points earned by each horse in the divisions will be carried forward into the Grand Final.
- In the case of a dead heat, points will be divided equally. In the event of the Grand Champion not being the actual winner of the Fingl, then monies earned by the winner of the race and the Grand Champion will be equally divided. This applies to monies in the Grand Fingl only.




