



- 3 BANKSY BUTLER: Enjoyed the run of race, checked critical stage, 6th G.P. 9th Feb 2,300 m. mobile Golden Kellett 1st. Possibility.
- 4 BIN DULI: Form this time in disappointing, failed to show up R.R. Feb 2nd. Prominent early, faded, 6th Harvey 7th Feb 2.600 metres Glenice Play 1st. Would have to display improvement.
- DUSTIN: After completing hat-trick, badly away, R.R. 5th 4th Feb 2,200 metres Riverview Star 1st. Not favoured by draw.
- HIPPY JAY: Faced daylight for greater part of journey, wilted over final 400 metres, 8th G.P. 9th Feb 2,300 m. mobile 7-6 Golden Kellett 1st. Not the roughest.
- 7 SUSIE GIRL: In front for most of the race, had no answer to Golden Kellett over concluding 200 metres, 2nd G.P. 9th Feb 2,300 m. mobile 6-9. Strong claims on last effort.
- 8 JIDALEY: Fair way back when race under way, rattled home into 4th place G.P. 9th Feb 2,300 m. mobile 7-4 Golden Kellett 1st. Rate among chances.
- DEWBURN: Beginning 2nd line G.P. 9th Feb finished determinedly, 3rd 2,300 metres mobile 7-1 Golden Kellett 1st. Could be fancied.
- 10 BRONZE BULLETT: Appeared last G.P. 15th Dec. 8th 2,600 metres mobile 8-6 Mac 1st. A long period since saluting Judge.

CONDITIONS GOVERNING 1974 INTER-DOMINION PACING CHAMPIONSHIP

POINTS SYSTEM: Macal bas 800 82 gylessy

The Championship will be conducted on the points system which shall be awarded as follows-

Points shall be awarded to each horse actually starting and finishing a race of a Qualifying Division on the basis that the winner of a Qualifying Division will receive in points the equivalent of the number of horses previously selected by the Committee as the maximum number of horses to compete in each Qualifying Division.

The second horse in each Qualifying Division will receive the next lower number in points and the third horse will receive the next lower number with each horse finishing thereafter receiving in order one lower number in points that the preceding horse until the last horse finishing in a maximum field will receive ONE (1) point.

The winner of each Qualifying Division will receive ONE (1) BONUS POINT to be added to the points already earned for that race.

No points will be allocated for fastest time,

A horse that is scratched from a Qualifying Division or a horse that does not complete the race will not be allocated any points for that particular Qualifying Division,

In the event of a horse being scratched or not completing the course, points will be allocated as before with the winner and other horses finishing the race entitled to receive their maximum number of points as if a full field had competed and finished the course in that

In the event of a dead heat all points of the horses dead heating shall be added together and equally divided.

GRAND FINAL:

The ten (10) horses gaining the greatest number of points in the Qualifying Divisions shall be eligible to compete in the Final of the INTER-DOMINION PACING CHAMPIONSHIP.

In the event of two or more horses each scoring equally the minimum number of points entitling them to be eligible for the Final and thereby producing a field exceeding the number designated by the Western Australian Trotting Association or producing a field exceeding the safety number for Gloucester Park then the Grand Council shall decide in its discretion which of the horses with equal points shall start in the Final.

And settlement of winning doubles bets made prior to withdrawal shall be subject to deduction from their face value of half of the amounts set out in the above table.

- (h) Where the horse ordered or permitted to be withdrawn is at "odds on" the Stewards may-
 - (i) If there is sufficient time: declare off all bets on the remaining horses and order that betting on the race shall be re-opened or
 - (Ii) If there is insufficient time to re-open betting, declare that all bets on the remaining horses shall be settled at Totalisator odds.
- (2) No provision of paragraphs (g) or (h):
 - (a) affects the discretion of the Stewards to declare all bets off in special circumstances:
- (b) prevents a bookmaker from laying odds against a horse in a race, after the Stewards order or permit the withdrawal from the race of any other horse:
- (k) if, in the opinion of the Stewards, a horse has been prevented from starting by a mechanical failure of a starting gate, the Stewards may declare that the horse to be a non-starter and shall thereupon declare all bets on that horse made on the course, on the day of the race, to be off; and where the horse so declared to be a non-starter was quoted:

STEWARDS' REPORT

GLOUCESTER PARK - SATURDAY, FEBRUARY 9, 1974

RACE 1: MISS COUTHIE (R. Sangalli) tangled in its gear shortly after the start — a warning was issued. HIGH CAM (W. Whitfield) missed the start slightly. R. Sweetman was cautioned for allowing his horse to move out slightly in the run to the winning post. L. J. Robinson CARLOS ADIOS was reprimanded for attempting to take a position where there was insufficient room in the front straight the last time,

RACE 2: PLACID WAY (L. J. Robinson) left its feet in the score up checking several horses including JAY MODE but all horses had regained their position at the release point, MAC (B. Warwick) left its feet in the back straight the last time. Reinsman B. Warwick stated that the horse had cross fired and struck itself - a warning was issued in respect to the pacer. Shortly after the start ACE DILLON (G. A. James) was slightly checked. This was caused by LIGHT BADGE (R. Buswell) tightening JAY MODE (L. Marriott) and that pacer in turn moving on to ACE DILLON (G. A. James). R. Buswell was severely reprimanded and told that a repetition would result in more severe action being taken. On the turn out of the front straight the second time EBONY ROCK (G. Lilleyman) was moved off the fence into the one out line causing HILL ORO (R. J. Starkie) to be moved out of its position for some distance. EBONY ROCK was pulling extremely hard at this point. As there were some mittigating circumstances G. Lilleyman was issued with a warning. When retaking his position in the one out line HILL ORO caused MAC (B. Warwick) to be slightly checked. A severe reprimand was issued to R. J. Starkie driver of HILL ORO. L. Mitchell was questioned regarding his driving tactics on PARK LODGE. Mitchell stated that he was unable to secure a clear passage until the turn out of the back straight the last time, by this time the winner EBONY ROCK had moved away to a considerable lead. This was borne out by the observations of the Stewards and no action was taken.

RACE 3: ROYAL FORCE (J. Retzlaff) galloped at the start losing considerable ground. WAITAWHILE BOY (NSW) (R. Pracey) was a little slow to begin, TANAKA (B. Cushing) was slow into stride, in the front straight the first time YOUNG ROBBIE (K. Tyler) moved off the fence causing ADIOS VICTOR (NSW) (A. Bray) to race wide for a short distance before taking its position. K. Tyler was warned, K. Wills BRET ARMAGH (Vic) was severley reprimanded for prodding his horse in the run to the winning post, K. Wills was reprimanded for unduly looking around throughout the race. As the field moved into the back stragiht the last time ROYAL FORCE received a check and left its feet. This was found to have been caused by WAITAWHILE BOY (NSW) moving sharply off the fence at this point, R. Pracey was reprimanded and told to exercise every care in future.

RACE 4: BEAU DECCA was examined by the Club's Veterinary Surgeon on the Course and found to be Iame. BEAU DECCA was withdrawn by order of the Stewards acting on vet's advice. Shortly after the start BAY BRIGADE (R. J. L. Williams) received a check and lost a little ground. This was found to have been caused by a general tightening of the field at that point — mainly contributed to by B. Giudice was severely reprimanded and told that a repetition could result in action being taken against him.

RACE 5: HARLERAY (Qld.) (R. J. Smith) galloped at barrier rise. This pacer will be excluded from the draw for the remainder off the series. WEE CENT (L. Lindau) lunged as the barriers were released and broke a crupper. WEE CENT had to be retired from the race. BANGALORE (R. Grantham) was a little slow into stride. On the turn out of the back straight the last time MISS DUNDEE (M. R. Johnson) received a check and left its feet causing FORBES ADIOS and BANGALORE to be severely checked behind the galloping HARLERAY and WEE CENT. An inquiry was held into this incident.

official film it was found that the incident was caused by C. N. Pike PALEFACE ADIOS (NSW) allowing his horse to move down on to BANGALORE (R. Grantham) that horse in turn being forced on to MISS DUNDEE, causing MISS DUNDEE to gallop. C. N. Pike was suspended from driving in races for two (2) scheduled metropolitan meetings.

RACE 6: MALE RULER (R. Walton) left its feet under pressure shortly after the start was effected. A warning was issued. Turning into the back straight the sulkies of BANKSY BUTLER (R. Pollock) and HIPPY JAY (L. Marriott locked wheels. This was found to have been caused by a general tightening of the field at this point and no blame could be attached to any particular driver.

RACE 7: OPERA HOUSE (NSW) (J. Schrader) galloped badly at barrier rise and hung in the early stages of the race. Reinsman Schrader stated that OPERA HOUSE had begun very fast from the second line and had to be checked severely to avoid contacting the sukies of the horse in front of him - this caused OPERA HOUSE to gallop, BOLD JASON (NSW) (F. J. Willis) was a little slow into stride.

NOTICE TO PATRONS

CONDITIONS OF RACING

All races to be run under the Rules of Racing made under the Constitution and Rules of the Western Australian Trotting Association. In all races when two or more horses are on identical marks, the horse whose name appears first will occupy No. 1 pole position, the other positions following in rotation.

REFUSAL OF NOMINATION

The Committee may, in its absolute discretion, at any time after receipt of a nomination, cancel the same without giving any reason therefor,

If, after the handicaps are declared for a race a horse wins or is placed in another race, the handicap of that horse may be re-adjusted by the Handicapper.

STARTING Horses are under the starter's orders after the whistle has been blown to take their positions at the barriers.

PROTESTS

A driver of a competing horse placed 1st to 5th inclusive, may protest against the winner, or any placed horse on the grounds of interference, crossing, jostling, or any improper act or conduct of the driver of such horse. The protest must be made to a Steward BEFORE THE DRIVER LEAVES THE TRACK AND PRIOR TO ALL CLEAR BEING DECLARED.

BOOKMAKERS

The public is notified that Bookmakers must set the investor up to \$500 on the price shown on the Board until the sounding of the horn calling the horses to the barrier (approximately 3 minutes to the start of each race), after which time the limit of liability shall be \$200.

In the event of a dead heat, payment will be made on a basis of half

the value of the ticket.

On all Betting tickets issued by Bookmakers the name of the Horse and the amount of the Bet must be clearly written. Should a dispute arise and it is found that this has not been done, a decision may be given against the Bookmaker.

Investors must check their tickets for the correct Name of Horse and Amount, as no claim will be recognised after the acceptance of the

All credit bets must be confirmed by the investor with the Bookmaker concerned, prior to the start of the race.

No person other than the Bookmaker, or his Employee shall be upon the Betting Stand of that Bookmaker.

LOST BETTING TICKETS

Assistance by the Stewards in recovering bets made on the course, can only be afforded to patrons who have lost their betting tickets if they can name the bookmaker.

WIN AND PLACE TOTALISATOR

Ask for Numbers, Not Names
The date of Ticket can be identified by the Meeting number.

PLACE TOTE

Pays First, Second and Third Horse where 8 or more starters. Pays First and Second Horses only where 7, 6, or 5 starters, Where 4 or less starters, only Win tickets will be sold.

INVESTORS SHOULD NOTE Every purchaser of a Ticket must satisfy himself that he has received the Ticket he applied for, and every holder, entitled to a dividend must see that he has proper dividend before leaving the window, as no subsequent claim will be recognised.

TOTALISATOR DUTY ACT BY-LAW 9 No dividend shall be recoverable or paid except on presentation of the ticket for which the dividend is claimed, or after the expiration of a months the date of the declaration of the dividend.
