Mr KYLIE HARRISON appeared on behalf of the HRV Stewards

The stewards say if any contact is made, the appropriate charge is under rule 168(1)(e) and the appropriate fine is \$500, regardless of whether the action was intentional or not. There is no suggestion by the stewards that it was intentional in this case.

We think in the interests of consistency of penalties, the extent of the contact and the circumstances of the race should be taken into account. Taking into account all the circumstances, Ms Towers' good record, the fact that the contact was minimal and there seemed to be no response from the horse, we consider that a fine of \$250 is appropriate. We note that this is less than set out in the minimum penalty guidelines but they are only guidelines.
